## Sensory

#### Plant a Flower Sensory Bin

#### **Materials**

- Plastic Container
- Dried Black Beans (or Soil/Dirt)
- Small Plastic Flower Pots/Cups
- Silk Flowers
- Shovels
- Old Flower Seeds



#### Possible Ways to Interact with the Materials

Children can use the shovels to fill the pots with black beans and plant the flowers, separate the flowers based on color or texture, use the pots to scoop up the dirt, and more!

## **Art Project**

#### Painting with Flowers

## **Materials Needed**

- Tempera Paint
- Paper Plates
- Flowers
- Paper

#### Instructions

Pour paint onto paper plates. Have children dip flowers into the paint and stamp them onto their papers to create their own masterpieces!



## **Finger Play**

#### Little Seed: A Scarf Song

Take a scarf and crumple it in one hand

A little seed for me to sow (pretend to hold a seed and plant it in the scarf)

A little Earth to make it grow (pretend to pat the soil down)

A little Sun (hold open hand in the air for the sun)

A little Shower (wiggle fingers move down over other hand)

A little wait (fist on chin, like waiting)

And then a flower (open hands together, the scarf opens up like a blooming flower)
