



Health & Safety

Fire Safety in Family Child Care

- 1. Have a comprehensive fire safety plan.
- 2. Smoke detectors are installed in key areas and tested monthly.
- 3. Fire extinguishers are placed in accessible areas and providers have been trained in their proper use.
- 4. Fire drills are practiced monthly to familiarize both providers and children with the exit routes and meeting points outside of the home.
- 5. Electrical outlets should have covers or be childproofed.
- 6. Any flammable materials, such as cleaning supplies and paper products, should be stored away from heat sources.

Grants

Did you know as a licensed child care program, you can apply for a training stipend?

This stipend can be used to cover the cost of required trainings for programs working towards or maintaining an ExceleRate Illinois Circle of Quality. The stipend can cover up to 80% of the training fee and the full cost of travel and/or lodging accommodations needed.
